Since 7 April 2025, I have had the immense honour of serving as deputy mayor of our beautiful municipality. I carry out this role with respect, motivation and total commitment. I would like to take this opportunity to express my sincere thanks, both personally and on behalf of our section, to my predecessor, Raphaël Schmitz, for all he has achieved for the municipality of Junglinster.

My responsibilities include the environment, nature and climate protection. These are key areas in which our municipality often plays a pioneering role. The

energy efficiency of our buildings, the increased use of renewable energies and the conservation of our resources are my priorities in this area. The planning and expansion of our future resource centre will be an important project for the coming years.

As the person responsible for culture, I am particularly pleased that we will soon be able to welcome our approximately 460 pupils to the new music school on the 'Op Fréinen' site. It will offer them optimal conditions for their musical education in a central location. Culture also plays an extremely important role in our community life. With the future cultural development plan for the next ten years, we are setting important priorities for the future of our municipality.

Accessibility is also particularly important to me. The transformation of our infrastructure, such as the lift in front of the cultural centre, illustrates how a measure that is necessary for some can benefit everyone.

In the coming months, we will be able to partially open the Borrigs Castle park to the public, with a new entrance on the 'Piedchen' side. The INPA's analysis of the house should also be completed shortly.

I am very pleased that we are finally making progress with the reconstruction of our community centre. Public tenders are planned for early 2026 so that work can begin after the collective holidays.

PROTECTING THE ENVIRONMENT, CLIMATE AND NATURE IN OUR MUNICIPALITY

These issues are becoming increasingly important to us all. At CSV Junglinster, in collaboration with our councillor responsible for the environment, Tom Weber, we are committed to working on several levels to support our municipality.

All our new buildings meet high standards of energy efficiency and sustainability.

Housing: financial assistance for energy-efficient renovations; renewable energies; rainwater harvesting; repair subsidies for household appliances, to name but a few examples.

In order to bring more greenery to our localities, “tiny forest” projects are currently being planned, for example. The first planting of this type was carried out in Gonderange with the help of around 50 motivated citizens.

The recycling centre is undergoing a major expansion on the adjacent site. It will also follow the concept of a resource centre, focusing on reuse, repair and sharing.

In our municipality, we also have three sites where green waste can be deposited at any time.

Other activities, such as the big clean-up, are organised each year by our environmental committee.

In order to protect our water sources, our municipality regularly purchases land in these areas. A major nature conservation project for our bats was carried out this year in Weimerech. To prevent food waste, our municipality supports ‘Ôpen Food’, which distributes food that would otherwise be thrown away to 60-70 people every week free of charge.
