MID-TERM REVIEW

SCHOOL AND FAMILY

The school site in **Junglinster** is currently being adapted to cope with the constantly increasing number of pupils:

- 8 additional classrooms in the 'Jean-Pierre Welter' building, thanks to the construction of a new floor.
- A new extension comprising six classrooms is planned from 2027 onwards.
- Renovation of the 'Josy Oliniger' building to create additional spaces dedicated to non-formal education.

The new '**an der Loupescht**' after-school care centre, officially inaugurated on 15 May, marks an important milestone for childcare provision in our municipality.

From 2027, the first children will be able to attend the "**Naturcrèche**" and enjoy their first enriching experiences in contact with nature. We are thus setting a new, significant benchmark for a forward-looking, diverse and high-quality educational and childcare landscape.

Furthermore, the school campus in **Bourglinster** will be modernised and expanded. In Gonderange, land has been acquired with a view to future expansions, thereby ensuring long-term planning certainty.

This autumn, **the music school** will open its doors on the '**Op Fréinen**' site. It will offer children and adults with a passion for music from both our municipality and

the wider region a modern and inspiring venue in which to discover and develop their talents.

These projects, which have largely been implemented under the leadership of our mayor, **Romain Reitz**, and the aldermen **Françoise Hetto-Gaasch** and **Raphaël Schmitz**, underline our clear commitment to providing high-quality care and support for our children.





CHILDREN, YOUNG PEOPLE AND COMMUNITY ORGANISATIONS

To make our town an even more pleasant, modern and child-friendly place to live, it is particularly important to actively involve our children and young people in community life. With the recent creation of the **Children's Town Council**, a significant step towards enabling young people to have their say and take on responsibilities from a very young age has been taken.

We are also committed to offering a wide range of safe options for getting home: the **NightRider**, the municipality's **LateNight bus** program and the **Night Life bus** provide several flexible options.

Young people who obtain a **graduation diploma** should receive appropriate recognition. That is why, in future, **every** diploma, regardless of its form, will be rewarded financially.

With the **pump track** near Lënster Lycée, the **new calisthenics park** and the "**Bouldercube**", new modern leisure and sports facilities have been created which are particularly appealing to young people. At the same time, we are encouraging cultural exchanges through a €300 subsidies for the purchase of an **Interrail ticket** for young people aged 18 to 25.

Volunteering remains a cornerstone of our social cohesion. That is why we will continue to support our local organisations, both financially and logistically. The new **Ceremony to honour deserving citizens** marks a further step in this direction. We wish to evaluate and adapt this concept in order to increase the visibility of this commitment.

The Sports Awards Ceremony has also been modernised by the Sports and Youth Commission.

SENIORS, SOCIAL AFFAIRS AND HEALTH

As part of the expansion of the CIPA in Junglinster, we have ensured that **20 additional beds** are reserved for our residents, bringing the total to 60 beds. Furthermore, the Club «Activ Plus» has moved into its new premises in JongMëtt in 2025 and is now easily accessible to all.

We have ensured that health and accessibility are strongly represented on two advisory committees. **Accessibility** in our buildings is a key priority for us.

Furthermore, we have arranged for the installation costs of the **telephone alarm system** to be covered by the municipality, as it is important to us that our elderly residents can remain in their own homes for longer.





People on low incomes who receive the ‘**Cost-of-Living Allowance / Energy Allowance**’ are entitled to additional support from the municipality amounting to 50 per cent.

INTEGRATION, LIVING TOGETHER, CULTURE AND CITIZEN PARTICIPATION

Local associations play a vital role in the quality of community life.

After the **clubhouses** in Altlinster and Eschweiler, plans for a clubhouse in Imbringen will be finalised this year. The former school in Beidweiler has recently been transformed into a clubhouse. Work to convert the Eisenborn chapel into a community centre is continuing with the involvement of INPA. In Rodenbourg, a new clubhouse will also be built in the coming years.

Playgrounds are central to social integration. New, attractive playgrounds have therefore been created in

Godbrange, Beidweiler and, most recently, at the Jong-Mëtt in Junglinster. At the same time, we attach great importance to the regular inspection of all existing playgrounds, their renovation and, where necessary, their selective expansion.

Through **citizen workshops**, we are implementing the Pact for Living Together. The ideas developed there are being translated into concrete measures: neighbourhood festivals are a first step in this direction.

For the coming years, numerous projects remain on our agenda. We will continue to advocate for the installation of a roof over the pétanque court at “Loupescht” site and for the installation of drinking fountains in playgrounds and public spaces.

The **2026–2035 Cultural Development Plan** sets out a strategic framework and a clear vision for a dynamic and modern cultural life across the whole of the municipality of Junglinster. A cultural life that brings people



together and fosters intercultural coexistence, whilst promoting local heritage and the identity of our villages.

In collaboration with the INPA, we are working towards the partial opening to the public of the **park** at the Borrigs estate. The 'Flammant' Park, situated behind the town hall, is currently being developed in collaboration with INPA, thereby creating in the future a new and pleasant green space for our residents. We also hope to finally move forward with the park project in Eisenborn.

ENVIRONMENT, RESOURCES AND ENERGY

Our commitment to the Climate and Nature Pact is paying off. Our ambition is very clear: to achieve climate neutrality for our municipal services by 2030. Furthermore, we also wish to involve citizens and businesses as fully as possible in this initiative.

We have already implemented:

- Flood protection measures
- Ongoing adjustments to our **financial subsidies** in support of nature and climate protection
- **Solar panels** on all new municipal buildings and, where possible, on existing buildings.
- Use of **sustainable building materials** in our projects, incorporating concepts that promote an effective circular economy.
- **Repair incentive** for household appliances – 'Repair Café' six times a year.
- Green roofs and more green spaces in public areas to promote biodiversity.
- The first 'Tiny Forest' project in Gonderange has been implemented.
- Bins for **green waste**, accessible at all times.
- **Active protection of springs**, through the purchase of plots of land across our municipality.

In addition, the following measures are planned:

- More nature in our villages: further communal areas will be left unsealed to increase biodiversity, improve rainwater infiltration and provide better protection during heatwaves.
- Measures to facilitate the use of **rainwater** in order to conserve drinking water.
- The '**Recycling Centre**' will be expanded, with a focus on **reuse, repair and sharing**.
- Constructive support for the '**wind farm**' project in our municipality.
- Introducing **adoption programmes** for small communal green spaces.
- Promoting **shared energy facilities** in new housing developments to enable more efficient use of this infrastructure..





HOUSING

The four houses in Godbrange and the 12 housing units in the JongMëtt in Junglinster have been sold under a long-term lease. We have thus created **affordable housing** within the municipality. The former concierge's residence at the Gaston Stein Multi-purpose Centre has been converted into additional emergency accommodation to help families in need.

MOBILITY AND SAFETY

Mobility within our municipality is a key priority for us. Once the works on **rue de la Gare** have been completed this summer, work on the **Junglinster main road** will begin in 2027. Soft mobility will play a central role, with a 30 km/h speed limit in the town centre and safe cycle paths.

As part of the 'Laangwiss 3' development plan, a new access road to the Route de Rodembourg will be created. This will enable the reorganisation and improvement of transport in the commercial zone.

Construction of the cycle path between Gonderange and Junglinster is due to begin in late 2027, thereby connect-

ing the 'Laangwiss' commercial zone. The link between the **cycle paths** PC2 and PC4, between Olingen and Junglinster, will run via the area known as "Weimerich".

ADMINISTRATION

Following the fire in 2024, reconstruction work on the town hall can finally begin this year; completion is scheduled for late 2028.

The refurbishment of the **barn in Borrigs Park** will create a new space for the municipal council. In addition, a pleasant new meeting room will be set up there, where it will also be possible to host weddings.

TRADE, ECONOMY AND FINANCE

We have made a further plot of land available to a local craft business through a long-term lease. The new trade association, Nova Lënster, is receiving financial support. Together with the new businesses that will establish themselves here as part of the 'Laangwiss 3' development plan, this will help to make Junglinster's commercial area even more attractive.

We closely monitor our municipality's financial situation at all times.

A key indicator in this regard is the ratio of our day-to-day operating costs to our revenue, which comes mainly from the state grant. We record a healthy surplus every year, which allows us to carry out major infrastructure projects.

Over the next few years, our population is set to reach 10,000. This also means we will require significant investment in the future. We will take particular care to ensure our municipality maintains its healthy financial position, enabling us to continue providing a good quality of life for all of us.



ËNNERWEE FIR IECH

Three years ago, we set ourselves an ambitious programme, and we can now say that a number of major projects have already been successfully completed.

At the same time, we still have a lot to achieve, as we want our municipality to continue to develop in an active and sustainable way in the future.

Beyond political debates, it is important for us, as a party, to discover new ideas and concrete projects directly on the ground. For example, during a joint visit to an innovative housing project in Schwebach, in the municipality of Saeul, we gathered information and gained fascinating insights into a new concept for sustainable housing. This also shows that this approach has the support of our members: we do not just talk about the future; we examine concrete solutions and return to the municipality with new ideas.
